

Explore the great outdoors along the Garden City Greenway

STANDALONE FARM AND GREENWAY CAFÉ
Need a break from your walk? The Greenway Café has plenty of hot and cold snacks to recharge for the rest of your adventure. Please note the Greenway Café is open seasonally.



ICKLEFORD TUMULUS
Under a prominent stand of trees lies two bronze age burial mounds, these are a scheduled ancient monument. Please help protect this monument by leaving the ground undisturbed.



HILLBROW GRASSLANDS
This chalk grassland is home to a rich tapestry of wildflowers, starting with cowslips in spring followed by majestic pyramid orchids and carpets of kidney vetch, ox eye daisy and knapweed. This floral diversity makes it an important area for butterflies and moths.



MANOR WOODS AND WILLIAN ARBORETUM
These two neighbouring areas of woodland offer a range of areas to explore, play in and have a picnic. There is also a small community orchard where you're welcome to help yourself to an apple in the autumn.



WYMONDLEY WOOD
A 200-year-old mosaic of grassy glades within plantation woodland. Includes a groundwater-fed ancient pond which connects to a stream and second pond.



RADWELL MEADOWS AND PLANTATION
Radwell Meadows is the ideal place to enjoy the countryside, children's play area and picnic tables.



CROFT LANE ORCHARD



NORTON POND
This is a seasonal pond which fills up during winter and spring and tends to dry out during summer. This provides important habitat for breeding amphibians such as newts which risk being eaten by fish in more permanent ponds.



WILLIAN POND
Situated in the scenic surroundings of Willian Village, this is a popular spot with local anglers as well and abundant wildlife including bats.



TELFORD MORTON SCULPTURE
A Letchworth resident and artist, Telford Morton loved the green countryside that surrounded the town. A keen allotment gardener, Morton's artwork can be seen in locations in Letchworth.
